Feed The Kids Columbus

Our Story

What began as a one-time volunteer opportunity for founder Ashley Kanney, soon grew into a dedicated mission to address childhood food insecurity in our community. With a focus on filling gaps, Feed The Kids Columbus (FTKC) launched to provide support where it was most needed—ensuring students have access to food during extended school breaks and snacks throughout the school day. To our knowledge, FTKC offers the only comprehensive snack program of its kind in Columbus, giving students the "food tools" they need to stay focused, learn effectively, and manage hunger-related challenges. From its start in Ashley's garage, supporting just 97 students, FTKC has expanded to reach over 8,600 children across 30 schools in Greater Columbus, impacting lives and creating lasting change.



Feed The Kids Columbus strives to ensure food insecure children in Central Ohio have access to nutritional meals and snacks, so they can learn and grow.

Serving Central Ohio

FTKC partnered with 30 schools spanning four school districts (Columbus City Schools, Groveport Madison Local Schools, Dublin City Schools, South-Western City Schools) and three community centers. FTKC supported over 8,600 children during the 2023-2024 school year spanning over 17 zip codes. Childhood food insecurity is present in all zip codes.

Our Programs

FTKC Programs

FTKC is a nonprofit dedicated to addressing child hunger in Central Ohio through two core programs. The Extended Break Bag Program provides students with five days' worth of breakfast, lunch, and snacks for students to take home prior to the start of an extended school break. This program helps to ensure that children have access to nourishing food even when school meals are unavailable. Each bag includes child-friendly, easy-to-prepare foods. Additionally, FTKC's Snack Program supplies monthly snacks to partner schools, allowing teachers and staff to give snacks to students who may have missed breakfast or need help staying focused. Each classroom receives bins refilled monthly with snacks, and each student receives at least one snack bag per month. These programs bridge critical gaps, supporting students' health and focus both in and out of the classroom.

What Makes Us Different

Many amazing organizations are dedicated to fighting hunger throughout Ohio. However, FTKC strives to meet kids where they are, ensuring they have direct access to food without barriers like enrollment requirements. Since children often lack the ability to seek out food programs independently, we focus on providing snacks where they are needed most. FTKC partners with organizations like the Mid-Ohio Food Collective, which sources food for families, while we specifically purchase food for children. Together, we are collaborating to find innovative ways to maximize our collective impact and better serve our community.

The annual Bourbon & Bubbles event was attended by nearly 60 attendees, raising more than \$50,000.

Trinity Mega Packing

For the third year in a row, Trinity United Methodist Church (TUMC) helped support over 3,000 students packing up 100,000 food items for Winter Break. TUMC and their congregation donated over \$30,000 and put in almost 375 volunteer hours.

Financial Performance


Feed The Kids Columbus is able to sustain our mission through a diverse funding model. We rely on multiple streams of revenue to support our goal of combating child hunger.

A significant 48% is sourced from corporate gifts and sponsorships, which displays our strong community connections and a commitment from local businesses to invest in the well-being of young students. Individual donations account for 32% of our funding, which reflect widespread grassroots support from community members.

Finally, the remaining 20% of our funding comes from grants, which allows us to focus our initiatives and expand our reach.


This balanced funding approach enables us at Feed The Kids Columbus to provide support to the children that need it most.
